A Letter From Our Executive Director



In a world where the challenges facing our communities often feel insurmountable, it's easy to get lost in the noise of polarization and endless doomscrolling. While there may be no "easy" answer, I truly believe that nothing changes unless we get at the root of our human relationships and the stories we tell about ourselves and one another. I also believe there is nothing more essential than supporting the storytellers and meaning makers who are shaping our communities. These are the people who are helping neighbors build relationships with one another and making space for creativity and culture to thrive.

In the last year, I've had the privilege of witnessing this work firsthand: our neighborhood celebrating winter at our outdoor skating rink in Saint Paul, creative leaders gathering at the Rural Futures Summit in Fergus Falls, and artists facilitating connections through projects focused on rural-urban solidarity.



If you've traveled along rural Highway 210 in West Central Minnesota, you may have encountered our work to center artists in movements for economic justice. Erhard-based artist Kandace Creel Falcon created a painting of their goats that was transformed into a full-size billboard installation along the highway. The project serves as a meditation on the idea of "tending to the herd"—a reminder that we are all interdependent and responsible for one another's care.

This project embodies the kinds of connections and stories that emerge when we give artists the space to lead. And when artists lead with goats, well, it only makes sense that we do, too (because, let's face it, we know that artists are the G.O.A.T!).

As I look ahead to next year, I am looking forward to finding more ways that we can support the truthtellers, culture bearers and creative leaders that our communities need right now. Here's to connection, to small joys, to the power of artists. And yes, here's to goats.

Weaving a stronger safety net for artists



As an artist-led organization, we understand that **creating art is real work** that comes with its own set of challenges, including inconsistent income and dependence on gig opportunities. Every day, we hear from artists about how these pressures limit their ability to engage with their communities and make it difficult for many to see artmaking as a sustainable career.

That's the heart of why we are expanding Springboard's Guaranteed Income pilot, which invests in artists in the Rondo and Frogtown neighborhoods of Saint Paul and in rural Otter Tail County.

Alongside the pilot, our **Artists Respond: People Place and Prosperity cohort** created new work to prompt community conversation and connection about Guaranteed Income, leading up to a big announcement—the expansion of our pilot to serve 100 artists for 5 years!

Kandace Creel Falcón participated in Artists Respond: People, Place, Prosperity, a cohort of artists creating work to inspire narrative change. Falcón's painting of their three goats—symbols of community care and the rural value of tending to a herd—was displayed on a billboard in rural Minnesota for nearly a year.

We know that the hubs and homes that help artists build fulfilling lives and careers thrive at the local level.

We also know that these organizations, collectives, and community groups continue to need tailored resources and support to help them flourish, especially following the impacts of the pandemic.

That's why we launched the Creative Change Coalition in 2023. This isn't just another

networking group; it's a dynamic coalition of 150 organizations from 39 states, working together to connect local efforts and drive systemic change. The Coalition fosters collaboration and learning through virtual workshops, field conversations, and a wealth of resources, opportunities, and funding. In less than a year, we've hosted seven virtual events that have brought together nearly 600 practitioners and field leaders to explore topics like local advocacy, rural-urban solidarity, and federal funding strategies.


